It is, for now, the last in a set of papers that aims to help us engage with people of different religions, and shows how an attitude of humble faithfulness will enable us to share the good news about Jesus without being silenced by contemporary "tolerance".

The first part of a new series "Information and Communication Technology" presents some sobering data about how Australians engage with social media, and challenges us to guard how we spend our time and to be wise in how we use technology for the growth of God's kingdom.
